They also help unload the trucks that arrive several times a day. Manual labor?? That, and much more! Many jobs benefit from a woman's touch, especially arranging household items, food, and baby + sanitary supplies. There are some fears about joining Magokoro Net. These are some examples:

Q: What is volunteers' accommodation like?

A: A gym in Tono City located 50km away from seacoast disaster areas house volunteers.

Q: I don't have any transportation.

A: Transportation by bus is available to and from the disaster area everyday.

Q: Are shops open near the accommodation?

A: Convenience store, super market, restaurants are open within walking distance.

Volunteer works include taking out of mud and sludge, cooking for refugees, sorting relief goods, preparation for charities and volunteer supporting activities.

Be careful of nails and glass

During volunteer work there exists potential risk of injury. The report of today's work points:

- When a volunteer is clearing mud underneath of house floor, unrecovered broken glass is found.
- Nails often remain in house flooring.

These hidden dangers are the cause of injuries, eventually leading to tetanus a lethal disease. Please double glove with a heavy-duty type on the outer layer and use insole that prevents nails from penetrating shoe bottom.
