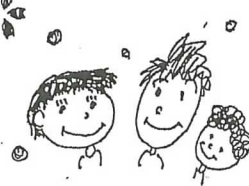

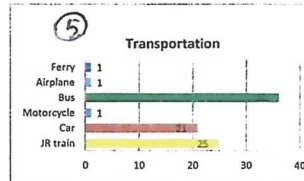
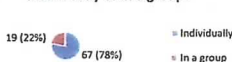
① How many times have you ever joined volunteer activities?

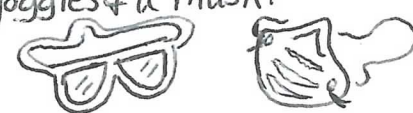
